

Author of the book "The German Girl" to visit Clymer Library

On Monday Dec 11 at 1:30 PM Armando Correa author of the historical novel 'The German Girl' Will appear at the Clymer Library on Firehouse Rd in Pocono Pines. The book is about the ship St. Louis that arrived in Havana Harbor in 1939 with over 600 Jews aboard and was turned away sending the passengers to a dreadful fate. The author who is not Jewish and who is currently the editor of the N.Y.magazine "People en Español" will talk about how he came to write this book as well as about his experience growing up in communist Cuba. This program will be of interest to book-lovers and to people interested in history.
